Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is committed to rebuilding flood affected schools in the Northern Rivers region, ensuring we build back better with flood resilient schools for local students and local communities. Funding for the school projects has also been provided by the Infrastructure Betterment Fund, which is jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

Project overview

As part of this commitment, a project is underway to rebuild Lismore South Public School and Lismore South Public School Ngunniboo Jarjums Preschool, after it was extensively damaged during floods in 2022. The new flood resilient facilities will include 13 modern classrooms, library, multi-purpose hall, administration areas, landscaping and separate preschool spaces.

Progress summary

Work is continuing on the school rebuild, which is on track for completion later this year.

- Remediation of the final areas of the school site is complete.
- The first school building modules were installed along Kyogle Street in March. Thank you to all the students who came to watch the crane and building teams lift the new classrooms into place and asked such great questions of the builder.
- The concrete slab in the undercroft is being poured.

Next steps

We have started installing the gantry steel to support the remaining building modules, which we are hoping to lift into place in two separate stages from:

- **Monday 25 May - classroom modules along Wilson Street**
- **Wednesday 3 June - preschool modules.**

We will advise the school and neighbours once these details are confirmed.
