Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the department is delivering a record \$3.5 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Liverpool Boys and Girls High Schools upgrade

The NSW Government will deliver a new co-educational high school in Liverpool by bringing together the existing Liverpool Boys and Liverpool Girls High Schools, following extensive consultation with the community. These funds will help deliver additional teaching spaces and upgraded core facilities to help transition to a co-educational facility.

Liverpool Boys and Girls High Schools, which are currently on adjoining sites, will come together within the area's new Liverpool Innovation Precinct. The new school will cater for up to 2,000 students, with facilities including new teaching spaces and specialist facilities, as well as a new library, hall, and sport field. The new school will form part of the Liverpool Health and Education Sub Precinct, in collaboration with NSW Health, TAFE NSW and the Liverpool City Council.

Community consultation, undertaken in late 2022, as part of planning for the upgrade to the high schools in Liverpool, found support for co-educational schooling in the area, particularly among future high school parents. Among future parents surveyed, 56 per cent stated a preference for a co-educational high school, contrasted with 18 per cent who said they would prefer a single-sex school.

In recognition of the preferences of some students and families, the co-educational schools will also consider opportunities for single-sex-focused classes and activities.

The school will offer an expanded range of subjects for students, with purpose-built facilities to deliver access to specialised pathways into health and higher education.

Progress update

Early planning is now complete which included consideration and studies of demographic trends, education requirements, intake areas, technical studies, planning requirements, transport links and possible shared area opportunities.

As the schools come together, the department will work with local primary schools to ensure a strong transition process from primary to high school for local students.

The early concept designs for the new high school are being finalised and will be shared in coming months.

In March 2024 we lodged a request for the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs), which is a key step in the statutory planning process. The SEARs advise the studies that need to be undertaken as part of the Environmental Impact Statement for the State Significant Development application.



Next steps

As part of our early planning for the school, we undertook site investigations for items of Aboriginal archaeological or cultural significance during the summer school holidays in 2024. Further early site investigations scheduled for the Autumn break, will include subsoil contamination testing, and geotechnical investigations to identify existing services.
