## Project update | February 2023

### Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

### Project overview

School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) is upgrading the facilities at Liverpool West Public School. The first stage of the upgrade will be ready in early 2023. We will deliver 16 new flexible teaching spaces, 4 special programs rooms, a new hall and covered outdoor learning area (COLA), and a new library.

The second stage of the upgrade, which will start once the first stage is complete, will deliver a further 28 new flexible teaching spaces, four new support rooms, and a preschool within the refurbished Mainsbridge House by early 2024.

### Progress update

The contractor, ADCO, worked through the summer school holidays to widen Flowerdale Road and create a new 'kiss and drop' area. They've also started work on the bus bay area, which will be finished in early February. Both areas will be in operation early this year, when Stage 1 of the upgrade will be ready for the school to use.

The roofs are on the new buildings, the outside stairs and walls have been built, and the contractor has begun working on the building facades.

Essential Energy have completed an electricity upgrade for the school, which will support a new ICT area.

The new furniture for the first stage of the upgrade has been delivered and will be installed in the new buildings once they are finished.

### Approval of heritage development

Liverpool City Council has now approved the Development Application for work on the heritage site where Mainsbridge House sits. The approval includes:

- the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) for the school hall
- refurbishment of Mainsbridge House, which will be used as the pre-school administration block. Two modern pre-school classrooms and a play area will also be built as part of the pre-school area. This is part of the Stage 2 works.

Work on the COLA has already begun and will be completed in March.

### Next steps

The contractors will continue to work on Stage One of the upgrade to the school. This will include:

- completing the staff car park and the bus bay works
- continuing work on the insides of the buildings, including painting, installing interactive whiteboards, and flooring
- landscaping.
