Project overview

Progress summary

Major works at Mainsbridge School are now complete. Students and staff have occupied the new facilities since Day 1 Term 2.

Installation of the sports field, soft fall, and play equipment to the site's southern portion will continue into Term 3.

Works taking place in the Winter school holidays

- Remediation and earthworks to enable the construction of the new sports field will continue during the school holidays from 26 June – 11 July (Monday – Friday).
- Installation and fit-out of the Immersion Room.

Frequently Asked Questions

What construction work will continue into Term 3 2021?

Installation of the sports field, soft fall and play equipment to the southern portion of the site will continue into Term 3.

The construction site will be separated with barriers and fencing and not pose a risk to staff, students or the local community. Both schools will be operational whilst the final external works are being completed.

How will construction traffic be managed?

Construction traffic will continue to access the site via the Williamson Crescent entry.

Traffic control will continue to be in place as required to manage pedestrian and vehicular movements near the site access points.

What safety measures will be in place?

Health and safety are our highest priority. We will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that construction works will be scheduled and managed to minimise impacts to the community where possible.

Perimeter fencing with shade cloth has been installed to prevent non-construction workers accessing the site.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Fencing and shade cloth is currently installed on the site boundaries to reduce dust and noise impacts on our neighbours. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.

What are the construction working hours?

The standard working hours for this project remain 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 4pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.
