## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7 billion over four years, continuing its program to deliver more than 200 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

## Project overview

A project is underway to relocate the Mainsbridge School. The new school will deliver purpose-built facilities that cater to the needs of the current students across primary and high school.

The new facility will provide flexible learning spaces including quiet zones designed with consideration for children with specific needs.

## Progress summary

School Infrastructure NSW is excited to announce the Mainsbridge School for Specific Purposes project is nearing completion. Students and staff are expected to officially open the new facilities from Day 1 Term 2.

Completed works will include:

- New Administration area in Block A
- New Library and Hall in Block B
- New learning rooms and courtyard areas in Block C & D
- The hydrotherapy pool in Block E
- Construction of the Mainsbridge SSP carpark
- External landscaped courtyards including play equipment and gardens.

## Next Steps

Commissioning and handover of the services are currently underway. Upcoming work during March includes:

- Final joinery and furnishing installation of new traffic condition signage on Williamson Crescent.
- Installation of the soft fall and play equipment to the main courtyard.
- Decanting and relocation of learning equipment from the old site to the new school.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What are the new traffic conditions in place on Williamson Crescent?

To help keep children safe, manage traffic flow and minimise congestion Liverpool Council has introduced new school zone speed limits and parking restrictions on Williamson Crescent. The speed limit rules are already in place and the new parking conditions start from 19 April. These are outlined below:

- A 40km/h speed limit school zone from 8.00am – 9.30am and 2.30pm – 4.00pm.
- No stopping and no parking restrictions in place from 8.00am – 9.30am and 2.00pm – 4.00pm.

### What construction work will continue into Term 2 2021?

Installation of the sports field, soft fall and play equipment to the southern portion of the site will continue into Term 2.

The construction site will be separated with barriers and fencing and not pose a risk to staff, students or the local community. Both schools will be operational whilst the final external works are being completed.

### How will construction traffic be managed?

Construction traffic will continue to access the site via the Williamson Crescent entry.

Traffic control will continue to be in place as required to manage pedestrian and vehicular movements near the site access points.

### What safety measures will be in place?

Health and safety are our highest priority. We will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that construction works will be scheduled and managed to minimise impacts to the community where possible.

Perimeter fencing with shade cloth has been installed to prevent non-construction workers accessing the site.

### What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Fencing and shade cloth is currently installed on the site boundaries to reduce dust and noise impacts on our neighbours. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.

### What are the construction working hours?

The standard working hours for this project remain 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 4pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.
