Planning update | December 2023

Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

The redevelopment of Melrose Park Public School will provide new classrooms and core facilities to meet anticipated enrolment growth in the area. The project is currently in the planning phase and will include:

- new classrooms and support learning classrooms
- new staff administration facilities
- a new library
- a new hall and covered outdoor learning area (COLA).

The final scope of the upgrade will be subject to business case and statutory planning approvals.

Progress summary

Over the last few months, the project team has continued to work with architects to develop masterplan options for the redeveloped school. A business case is being finalised to secure funding for the project to proceed into delivery.

Connection to Country workshop

There has been ongoing consultation with representatives from the Department of Education and Melrose Park Public School. This included a 'Connection to Country' workshop with the Aboriginal Education Consultative Group, First Nations employees and local members of the Aboriginal community.

The development of Melrose Park Public School will look to:

- foster and develop connections between teachers, students, the broader community, and Country
- celebrate and connect with Wallumedegal Country through the built form
- create culturally mindful areas both inside the built form and within the landscape.

Next steps

- We will work with internal teams to determine the best planning pathway for the project and start working on preparation for statutory approvals.
