

# Melrose Park Public School redevelopment Project update | February 2026

## Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the NSW Budget is delivering \$3.9 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

As part of the NSW Government's commitment to deliver expanded access to early childhood education, planning for this school will include an on-site public preschool.

## Project overview

The redevelopment of Melrose Park Public School will provide new classrooms and core facilities to meet anticipated enrolment growth in the area. This is in addition to the project to build a new high school for Melrose Park.

The project will deliver 32 new classrooms and 3 support classrooms, a new large public preschool, new administrative spaces and upgrade to site services, new library, covered outdoor learning area (COLA), outdoor learning spaces and play space and a new hall with a canteen and outside of school hours care (OOSH).

## Progress summary

Main construction works are well underway. Construction of the onsite rainwater detention tank and car park ground reinforcement have finished. Piling works and foundation works are ongoing, and structural building works have started.

## Next steps

- Continue piling works and pour the concrete slabs for all buildings.
- Set up the tower crane for moving materials on site.
- Continue works on the new carpark.
- Relocate site sheds to the western side of site.

The new school will be finished and operational for Day 1 Term 1 2027.



## Frequently Asked Questions

### When will the redevelopment be finished?

The redevelopment project will be finished and operational for Day 1 Term 1 2027.

### When does enrolment open for the new preschool?

The new preschool is scheduled to be open for Day 1 Term 1 2027. The school will communicate with their community when enrolment applications can be taken, which is expected to be approximately 6 months before the preschool opening date.

### **Who can enrol to the new preschool?**

Children turning 4 years old on or before 31 July of the school year may enrol. More information about enrolments can be found via <https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/curriculum/early-learning/public-preschools/enrolment>.

### **Does attending preschool at a school guarantee a Kindergarten place at the same school?**

No. Preschool enrolment is separate and does not guarantee enrolment at that school.

### **How many days per week can my child attend the preschool?**

Children typically attend 2 to 3 days per week. Exact attendance patterns are confirmed by the preschool during enrolment.

### **How do I apply for a job at the new preschool?**

Educators can:

- Contact the local office directly, and

### **Will the new preschool increase traffic or parking issues?**

The new public preschool will include a dedicated drop off/pick up area. Local traffic management was considered during planning to minimise neighbourhood impacts.

### **What measures will be in place to mitigate noise and dust during construction?**

Noise and dust controls are outlined via the authority approval conditions of consent. Our contractors must comply with these conditions and any other conditions which form part of the works contract with respect to noise and dust levels during construction.

The department will work closely with the school leadership and the appointed contractor to ensure construction impacts to the school and wider community are minimised.
