Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

A project is underway for a new primary school in Midtown Macquarie Park to meet anticipated enrolment growth in the area.

Midtown is a new urban neighbourhood being built in Macquarie Park that will include social, affordable and private housing, community facilities, retail, and green space.

The school will accommodate 750 students from Kindergarten to Year 6 and provide modern classrooms, administration and staff facilities, a canteen, a multipurpose hall, a library, and covered and landscaped outdoor learning areas.

This project is part of a broader strategy to cater for predicted enrolment growth in the Ryde area. Other school infrastructure projects in the area include the Macquarie Park Education Campus and an upgrade to Ryde Secondary College.

We have prepared a Response to Submissions report for the State Significant Development (SSD) application (SSD-56124984). This report responds to feedback received during the SSD application exhibition period.
