

Mona Vale Public School Project update | March 2022

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade Mona Vale Public School. The project will deliver:

- A new teaching and learning building (Block R) containing 6 learning spaces and 3 support classes
- Upgrading and refurbishing Blocks B, D, E and H which contain learning spaces, support units, reading rooms, staff facilities and amenities
- A new Performing Arts Centre (Block S)
- A new staff and administration space within Block R
- Removing buildings (Blocks C and G) and improving space and connectivity throughout the school for all students.

Progress summary

Construction of the project began in June 2021 and is progressing well.

The new canteen and hall refurbishment works are currently underway. Work on building the new teaching and learning block (Block R) has continued with the second level concrete slab pours completed, internal wall framing carried out, and the façade brick installation and roof starting this month.

Landscaping work to the outdoor play area adjacent to the junior playground covered outdoor learning area (COLA) is near to completion. The final concrete slab was recently poured, and this outdoor play area will be available for the students by the end of March 2022.

Next steps

Work will continue on the new teaching and learning block and hall refurbishment. The new canteen is close to completion and will be operational in the coming weeks.

Construction of the new Performing Arts Centre will be starting soon. Additional traffic management will be in place at the Emma Street carpark during these works.

What are the construction working hours?

Construction work hours are Monday to Saturday, 7:00am to 6:00pm. No work will be undertaken on Sundays or on public holidays.

Will construction take place over the Easter long weekend?

No work will be undertaken on Sunday or on public holidays.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements. Hoarding and shade cloth have been erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and local residents. Dust from construction works will be hosed down as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of students, staff, the local community and workers. Traffic controllers will be used where required to manage entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.
