The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Progress summary

The Monaro High School upgrade aims to improve the functionality of the school, creating more flexible learning spaces to accommodate new ways of teaching.

In July, the project team achieved another milestone for the school upgrade. Building B North and the Annex were finished and handed over to the school in time for Day 1 Term 3. The upgraded building includes new metal and wood workshops and four flexible learning areas.

With works to Building B North finished, workshop machinery and equipment has been removed from the indoor sports shed. The sports shed is now being used for indoor PE classes and sporting activities again.

Next steps

Work will continue throughout the year to finish the project. Remaining works include:

- Building B Central and South
- new performing arts centre (including administration centre)
- upgrades to amenities (Building J)
- external landscaping works.

We will continue to work closely with the school and contractor to minimise disruption. Thank you for your patience while we deliver this important school infrastructure.
