Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

We are upgrading the Support Unit at Moruya High School to better support students with disabilities and additional needs. The Department of Education is committed to providing educational facilities that meets the needs and reduces the impact of disadvantage for children and young people with disabilities and additional needs, their families and the broader community.

Work on the design is continuing to deliver seven new permanent classrooms spaces including practical activities areas, break out spaces, accessible toilet/change rooms, laundry, kitchen and staffroom as well as an outdoor play area and covered outdoor learning area (COLA) for students.

Works will also include a new access road and undercover drop off area and carpark for the precinct.

Progress Summary

We have completed the planning phase which includes the concept design shown above. The project will replace the existing demountables with a future focused Support Unit that will cater to the needs of students. The new Support Unit at Moruya High School will be utilising modern methods of construction that help reduce construction noise and disruption to the community. This involves manufacturing building parts in a factory, then transporting them to the site to be assembled. All classrooms within the Support Unit will be fitted with air conditioning.
