

Mosman High School upgrade

Project update | October 2023

Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

Mosman High School is being upgraded to provide students with the latest educational facilities for teaching and learning. The upgrade project is delivering 16 additional flexible learning spaces, a new library, a multipurpose gym/hall, a canteen, and administration/staff facilities. The project also includes new outdoor and rooftop play spaces.

Progress summary

The new Building G opened for Day 1 Term 3 2023, and the school have been enjoying using the new facilities. Over the spring school holidays, the contractor has been working on improvements to the new building and installing audio visual equipment in the multipurpose hall and theatre.

The demolition of Building C has now finished, and landscaping has started in the central area of the school where Building C was located.

The project has finished all asbestos containing material removal work, and there is no further asbestos removal anticipated for the remainder of the project. If any unexpected asbestos containing material is found, the community will be notified in accordance with the Department of Education's and the project specific Asbestos Management Plan.

Over the spring school holidays, work has also started on the staff carpark. This includes excavating the existing carpark and working on services, including water, electrical and gas, then resurfacing of the carpark. Once the carpark has been resurfaced, line marking and further landscaping work will start in this area.

Next steps

In February 2023, we advised the community that a raised 'wombat' pedestrian crossing was recommended to be put in on Gladstone Avenue near the corner of Keston Avenue, Mosman, in order to improve safety for students and the community. This was in response to an assessment of traffic conditions that was completed to meet the consent conditions of the project. Work on the pedestrian crossing, and associated removal of car parking spaces, is expected to take place by the end of the year. We will advise the community with more details via a works notification closer to the time.

Work will be taking place during term 4 2023 to restore an existing basketball court with a new surface and line marking.
