Mosman Council approved the location of the crossing, and an application to remove the tree that you mention in August 2023, in order to accommodate the new pedestrian crossing. As part of the tree removal application, an Arborist was required to inspect the tree, who came to the conclusion that the tree would not survive the new pedestrian crossing due to encroachment on the roots. It is not a tree of significance, and no biodiversity aspects were required to be considered in the assessment of the tree.	Closed	No
