Project overview

Murrumbidgee Regional High School is the new high school model for Griffith.

As part of this new model, the high school is receiving upgrade works across both Griffith and Wade sites, which will enable students to have access to a wide range of subject options and school facilities.

Progress summary

Griffith site

The new administration building and staff rooms are now complete. Students and staff have been using these spaces since late 2020. The new vertical circulation hub building is complete, providing new stairs and a lift to connect the multiple parts of Block A and the outside learning areas.

The project timeline for completing the Griffith site has been extended to cater for additional Block A roof and structural modifications required to comply with current Australian standards. The project is now expected to be completed by mid-2021.

Next steps

Upcoming works on the Griffith site includes:

- modifications to the Block A roof and building structure
- internal refurbishment to Block A classrooms
- construction of a covered outdoor learning area
- installation of directional signage.

Wade site

Works at the Wade site are now complete. Students and staff have been using the new learning spaces since late 2020. The upgrade includes:

- new learning and teaching spaces
- a new canteen
- a new library space
- a new administration office and staff facilities
- new covered outdoor learning areas
- external landscaping.

Frequently Asked Questions

How will traffic be managed?

Construction traffic will continue to access the Griffith site via the Willandra Street entry.

Traffic control will continue to be in place as required to manage pedestrian and vehicular movements near the site access points.

What safety measures will be in place?

Health and safety are our highest priority. We will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that construction works will be scheduled and managed to minimise impacts to the community where possible.

Perimeter hoardings have been installed to prevent non construction workers accessing the site.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Hoarding and shade cloth is currently installed on the site boundaries to reduce dust and noise impacts on our neighbours. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.

What are the construction working hours?

The standard working hours for this project remain 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holiday.

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
