Progress summary

Concept and schematic design is complete. The construction contract has been awarded to Zauner Construction. Detailed design has commenced, progressing into construction once a Complying Development Certificate (CDC) is obtained, which is likely to be mid to late 2019.

Site establishment commencing soon

Site establishment and minor early works to prepare the sites for construction will commence from late August 2019. This will include the erection of site fencing and signage, the setup of site facilities, installation of site access points and the commencement of preparation works for building conversions and refurbishments. Demountables have already been installed to provide temporary student accommodation during the construction period.



Construction impacts

The safety and wellbeing of the community is our priority and we will employ a range of measures to manage and control the construction impacts to the school and wider community.

- Fencing and shade cloth will be erected to reduce dust and noise impacts on the school and our neighbours.
- Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.
- Notifications to the school community and surrounding neighbours will be issued prior to works. Any potentially disruptive tasks will be undertaken during non-school hours.
