



Nangamay Public School

Information pack | December 2022

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

We are building Nangamay Public School to cater to the growing community in Glenmore Park and Mulgoa Rise. Opening on Day 1 Term 2023, it will include:



New modern teaching spaces and facilities for up to **400** students



20 air-conditioned flexible learning spaces



Library



Multipurpose hall



Sports court



Canteen



Special program unit



Covered outdoor learning area (COLA)

Project progress

Building is progressing well. The painting, installation of flooring and finishing of wet areas such as bathrooms has started. The contractors have also started building pedestrian crossings on Forestwood Drive and Darug Avenue.

The staff car park is almost complete, and the contractors have started work on the landscaping, the sports court, and the boundary fences.

What's next?

- Work on the new pedestrian crossings on Darug Avenue and Forestwood Drive will be finished by mid-January
- The contractor will finish the insides of the school buildings, such as painting, lighting, and furnishing
- The school signs will be put up and the pathways will be finished
- The contractor will continue landscaping, with some areas safely fenced off for Day 1 Term 1. All landscaping will be finished by mid-March 2023
- Working with the school leadership team to make sure the school is ready to welcome students on Day 1 Term 1 2023.

Summer holiday works

Construction work on Nangamay Public School will continue throughout the school holidays every day except public holidays.

We recently notified nearby residents of extended working hours, as approved by the Department of Planning and Environment. The working hours are 7 am to 10 pm Monday to Friday, 8 am to 4 pm Saturday and 8 am to 3 pm Sunday. The contractors will only do quiet indoor works between 6 pm and 10 pm weekdays and 1 pm to 4 pm on Saturday and Sunday.

We will ensure all work continues to comply with our approved noise management plan.

Term 1 2023 works

The school buildings will be open and ready to welcome students (K-6) from Day 1 Term 1 2023, Tuesday 31 January. There will also be play space, including green space, the sports court, and the covered outdoor learning area (COLA), ready for students to play in.

Landscaping will continue on the southern part of the school grounds in early Term 1 and will be finished in March. We will separate the areas being landscaped from the rest of the school with temporary fencing and shade cloth. The contractors will also schedule the work to reduce any disruption.

Starting at Nangamay Public School in 2023

The first day at school for students in Years 1 to 6 is Tuesday 31 January.

All students and families should arrive between 8:15 am and 8:25 am. Please use the accessible entrance on Deerubin Drive (see map) where we will welcome you with a balloon arch and red carpet

On arrival, teachers will be there to supervise, and there will be plenty of photo opportunities.

We will have a team to welcome you and show you how to get to the school hall. Students will be invited into the hall year group by year group from 8:45 am.

There will be an afternoon 'muster' in the hall for all students to make sure students leave the school safely. Families will be able to meet their children at the hall at 2:45 pm. School staff will support students during the afternoon dismissal to ensure their safety when crossing directly adjacent roads.

Kindergarten students

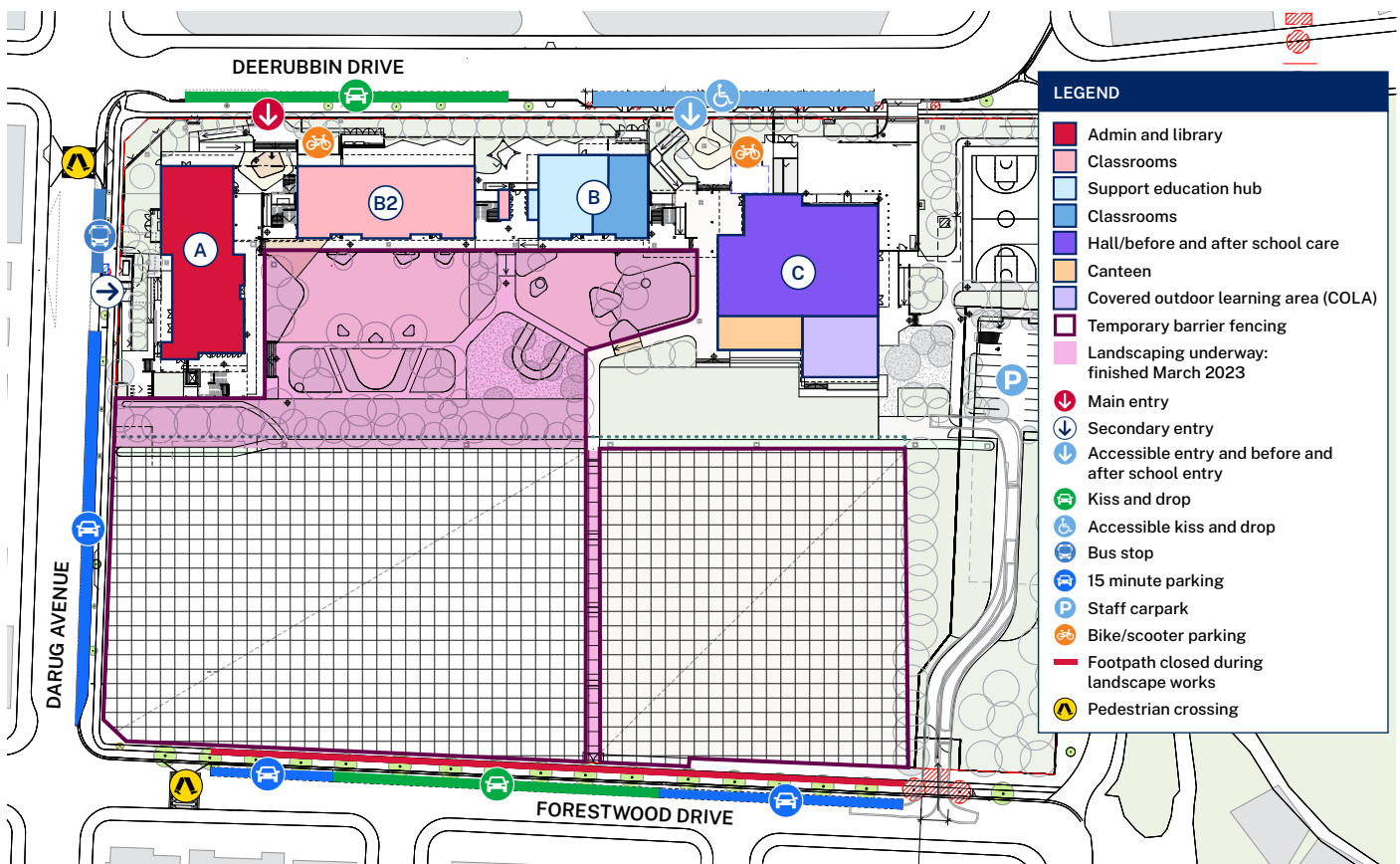
Kindergarten students are invited to join students in Years 1 to 6 on the first morning as there is a kindergarten transition on Tuesday 31 January 2023 8:45 am to 10:30 am. Best Start kindergarten testing will take place from Wednesday 1 February to Friday 3 February 2023.

The first 'official' day of school for kindergarten students will be Monday 6 February 2023.

School hours are: 8:45 am to 2:45 pm. The grounds will be supervised from 8:15 am.

Getting to school

Travel to Nangamay Public School for staff and students will be easy with convenient public transport, dedicated staff parking, two drop off and pick up zones – on Deerubin Drive and Forestwood Drive. There are also 15-minute parking zones on Darug Avenue and Forestwood Drive (see the school site map on previous page).

Kiss and drop

There is a ‘kiss and drop’ zone on Deerubin Drive, near Darug Avenue, outside the main entry gate, and a second one on Forestwood Drive (see the school site map on previous page). Note the accessible parking bays further along Deerubin Drive are only for students with disabilities and their parents and carers.

Parking

There is 15-minute parking along Darug Avenue and Forestwood Drive on school days. Other areas around the school are unrestricted parking.
