## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

#### The new school has:

- places for up to 400 students from Kindergarten to Year 6
- 20 flexible, airconditioned learning spaces for individual and group-based activities
- core facilities such as a library, canteen and staff admin spaces
- a multi-purpose hall as well as sports and play space.

The school will be open Day 1 Term 1 2023 to welcome new students.

# **Progress summary**

Since the last update, building has forged ahead:

- All school buildings now have roofs.
- The builders have started landscaping the areas of the new school facing the street.
- Work on a staff driveway on Forestwood Drive and a deliveries driveway on Deerubbin Avenue is underway.

The Department of Education received approval in September to install temporary buildings on the site if needed. As the build has progressed well, these will only be used if weather or other issues cause construction delays.

#### What's next:

- Once we receive approval from the Council, contractors will start building raised pedestrian crossings on Forestwood Drive and Darug Avenue. Residents and others who may be affected will be notified before the works begin.
- Work will continue on finishing the inside and outside of all four buildings in November, such as painting, flooring and finishing the wet areas.
- More landscaping work, including the boundary fences, sports courts, pathways, streetscapes and gardens, will be finished between now and January.
- Temporary school buildings will be used only if needed, and we expect some works, such as landscaping to continue until March.
