Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the NSW Budget is delivering \$3.9 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

To support current and future growth in the Wollondilly area, this project will deliver a new primary school and public preschool at 200 Fairway Drive in Wilton.

The primary school and public preschool will be opening Day 1 Term 1 2027, together with Stage 1 of the high school.

Progress summary

The construction contract tender is now closed. Tender documents are being reviewed and it is expected the construction contract will be awarded in September 2025.

Next steps

Over the coming weeks the precinct developer will continue to the prepare the primary and preschool school site for the start of construction.

Once the contract has been awarded, site establishment works including installation of temporary fencing, banner mesh and construction access work will start.

Will the schools be one K-12 school or function as two separate schools?

The primary school and high school will function as two separate schools – Preschool to Year 6 and Years 7-12. The schools will have shared facilities during the first year of operation.

What will the school names be?

The NSW Department of Education will release a survey to gain community feedback about school name options. Responses from the survey will help inform the decision on the new preschool, primary school and high school's names before being finalised.

What is happening with the Fairway Drive 'on' ramp?

This project is being managed by the developer, Landcom, who are proposing to build:

- a new northbound entry ramp onto the Hume Motorway
- a new southbound exit ramp from the Hume Motorway
- a new bridge over the Hume Motorway to improve access to and from North Wilton
- converting the existing Niloc Bridge into a dedicated pedestrian and cycle path.

The new ramps will become the main access to the North Wilton area.

Landcom is delivering this project on behalf of Transport for NSW, who will own and maintain the infrastructure.

We are working closely with Landcom and will share new information as it arises. In the meantime, you can keep informed by visiting their webpage: landcom.nsw.gov.au.
