

Nirimba Fields Public School Project update | November 2023

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$3.5 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

Planning for the permanent Nirimba Fields Public School is underway. In the short term, a purpose-built temporary primary school will be built to cater for Kindergarten to Year 6 students. The temporary school will be located at the corner of Triton Parade and Nabthorpe Parade, Nirimba Fields. It will be established along the southern boundary, occupying approximately 40% of the site, which will allow for the future construction of the permanent school.

Progress summary

The installation of in-ground footings and block piers for the temporary buildings has been completed and the temporary school buildings are being placed on site. A mobile crane has been mobilised to enable the facilities to be lifted safely around the school site. Traffic control measures will continue to be in place during crane operations.

Next steps:

- Public domain improvement works will be carried out on Nabthorpe Parade and Triton Parade that
 will assist teachers, students and visitors to access the new temporary school buildings, as well as
 improve the amenity in the local area. A detailed works notification will be provided outlining these
 works closer to the date.
- Digging service trenches to lay data fibres, conduits and electrical cabling.

Project benefits

The permanent school will accommodate 1000 students and will include:

- modern classrooms and support learning classrooms
- multipurpose hall for sports and performance
- a library, canteen and administration facilities
- covered outdoor learning area (COLA)

The temporary school will accommodate 419 students and will include:

- classrooms
- a library, canteen and administration facilities
- dedicated toilets
- on-site parking
