Project update | February 2024

Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

The upgrade of North Sydney Public School will deliver 19 new flexible learning spaces, a new administration area, library, hall, covered outdoor learning area and a new entrance gate on Bay Road. The refurbishment of the school's existing canteen and student amenities are also included in the upgrade works.

Progress summary

Buildings I and J are finished, and more classes will start to operate from the new buildings from Term 1 2024.

The State significant development application modification, for final works to take place on the project, was approved by the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (formerly the Department of Planning and Environment) in late December 2023.

Next steps

Works approved as part of the State Significant Development Application modification can now take place. During February 2024, the historical damage to the heritage fence along Pacific Highway will be rectified.

Over the 2024 April school holidays, final works are expected to start. These include:

- putting in playground equipment in the area next to Building J
- finishing the Yarning Circle next to Building A
- putting in tensile mesh to levels 2 and 3 of Building I.
