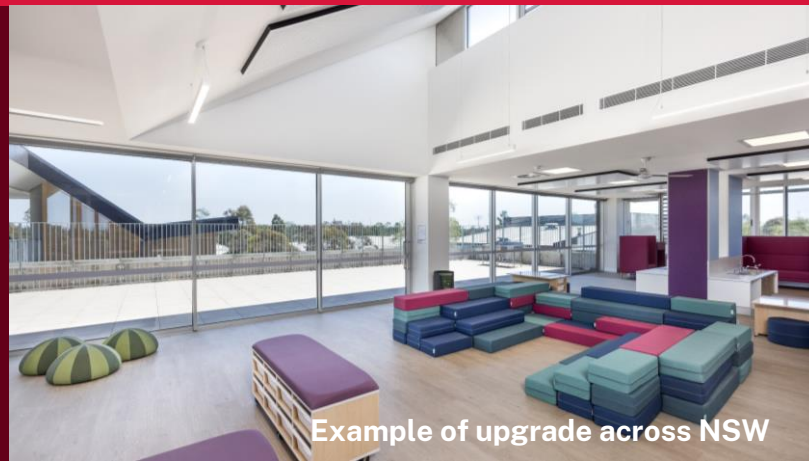

Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is delivering record education funding, including \$8.9 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

Orange Grove Public School is being upgraded to include additional classrooms and new core facilities to meet the enrolment needs for the community, and preserving the western green space at the school, which has been identified as an important element for the community.

The project will deliver:

- a new school hall, canteen, and Out of School Hours care (OOSH) facilities.
- new administration and staff facilities
- 8 new general learning spaces
- 2 new shared learning spaces
- new staff and student amenities
- 4 refurbished classrooms in existing buildings A and D with a new lift in building A
- upgraded Practical Activities Areas (PAA) and a new veranda in building D.
- a Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) and landscaping
- library relocation from building C to building B, to make way for a new homebase building in place of building C, which will be demolished.

Next steps

Our next steps are as follows:

- submit planning application in early 2025
- award construction tender in mid 2025
- commence construction in late 2025
- continue coordination with the Saturday Market operators to ensure the market can run smoothly during construction period
- continue coordination with OOSH care operators
