### Summer holidays construction works

#### Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

#### Parramatta West Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Parramatta West Public School. The project will deliver:

- 20 new permanent teaching spaces
- A new multipurpose facility/hall
- A new administration building.

Subject to planning approval, the project will be delivered in two key phases, with the new building on the north site to be completed first (by early 2021), followed by the work on the existing school (southern side) of the campus (by mid 2021).

#### Progress summary

Planning approval is close to being received from the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment. The construction contract has been awarded to Taylor Construction Group.

#### Summer school holiday works

Site establishment work will commence during the school holiday break. This involves installing temporary construction fencing and shade cloth, plus the set-up of the site amenities/ compound.

Main construction works are expected to start in early 2020.

Construction work will take place Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 6:00pm, and Saturday from 8:00am to 1:00pm. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently and we will minimise impacts on the community at every opportunity.

## Frequently asked questions

### What works will be completed over the holidays?

Site establishment work will be commenced during the school holiday break. This involves installing construction fencing and shade cloth, plus the set-up of the site amenities/ compound.

Main construction works are expected to start in early 2020.

### What are the construction working hours?

Construction hours over the summer break will be as per the standard hours:

- Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 6:00pm
- Saturday, 8:00am to 1:00pm

No work will be undertaken on Sunday or on public holidays.

### Will construction take place over Christmas and New Year?

No work will be undertaken from Saturday, 21 December to Sunday, 5 January 2020 inclusive.

### What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing will be erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access. Traffic control will also be in place to manage vehicular and pedestrian movement near the site access points.

### What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Temporary fencing and shade cloth will be erected to reduce dust impacts on the school and local residents. The site will be regularly hosed down as required to minimise dust.

### How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of students, staff, the local community and workers. Traffic controllers will be used where required to manage entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.
