## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

## Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade Pendle Hill High School to support the growing student and community needs.

The project will deliver 14 new learning spaces (including two multimedia rooms), an upgrade to convert the old library into 4 flexible learning spaces in Block E, a library, a lecture theatre, new staff and administration areas, student amenities, and outdoor learning spaces and landscaping.

## Progress summary and upcoming works

We are excited to announce that the Pendle Hill High School upgrade is almost finished. The construction of the new building (Block H) is nearing completion. Our team is currently focusing on preparing the learning spaces for operational use, external landscaping, and public domain works on streets surrounding the school.

Staff will start using the new administration and library facilities from Monday 20 March 2023, and students will start using the facilities from Day One Term 2 ( Wednesday 26 April 2023 ).

### Public domain works around the school

To improve pedestrian access around Pendle Hill High School, public domain upgrades are happening around the school. These works include:

- Installing raised pedestrian crossings on Binalong Road, Bungaree Road, and Burrabogee Road.
- Extending kerbs and footpath around the school to help improve traffic calming and public safety.
- Minor stormwater upgrades on the two intersections on Binalong Road.

### Driving to school

The City of Parramatta has introduced new parking restrictions around the school. The new rules are in place from March 2023. Please comply with the new traffic and road rules around the school.

### Upcoming Assets Management Unit works

Several short to medium-term improvement projects are underway at Pendle Hill High School. The Asset Management Unit (AMU) will deliver these separately to the SINSW Pendle Hill High school upgrade project. The work will include:

- Redevelopment of the agricultural farm to increase play space at the school grounds.
- Stormwater pit upgrades of the courtyard area in Blocks A, B, D and E.
- Construction of a new support unit classroom, chemical storeroom and amenities in Block A.
- Upgrades to student and staff toilet amenities in Block D.
- Upgrades to the multi-purpose sports courts, including constructing an accessible ramp.
