Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Penshurst Public School

An upgrade is underway to redevelop Penshurst Public School in response to projected growth in the local area. The project will deliver 47 new flexible learning spaces, new student, staff and administration facilities, a new library, hall and covered outdoor learning area, as well as a maximised open play space.

Progress summary

- The structure of the new building was finished in April 2020. Exterior and interior finishing works are progressing well.
- The planning for commissioning and opening of the new school in early 2021 has begun.

Next steps

Upcoming work activities include:

- installing external cladding, internal wall framing, ceiling sheeting, stairs, windows and steel roof structure for the new buildings
- installing plumbing, mechanical, fire and electrical services
- removing scaffolding
- removing the tower crane (anticipated late September 2020).
