Project overview

The upgrade of Picnic Point High School includes the construction of a new Technical Applied Science (TAS) building and upgrading the existing A and B buildings. See map overleaf.

The project will deliver the following new and upgraded facilities at the school:

- four new general learning spaces
- new TAS workshops and learning spaces
- new visual arts workshop and learning spaces
- new music learning spaces
- a new computer learning space
- upgraded and expanded administration and staff facilities
- landscaping and external improvements.

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Progress summary

Early works to prepare the site for the new TAS building are finished, and main works construction is underway.

This work includes:

- levelling the ground and bulk earthworks
- relocation of the existing sewer main and other inground services
- installation of the lift footings and lift shaft structure
- pouring concrete for the lower ground level foundation
- construction of the building's walls, stairs and the ground floor suspended slab.

This work maybe noisy at times and control measures have been put in place to reduce the effects of the noise on local residents in accordance with the project's approval requirements.

Works to upgrade Building A are also continuing. This work includes:

- levelling of the existing floor
- installing walls and structural columns, including wall and ceiling framing and lining
- installing new services for electricity, water and internet.

Construction Hours

These works will take place between the hours of 7 am and 5 pm Monday to Saturday. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.

Due to the nature of concrete pours, works will start at 7am and may continue until works are completed. The school and local community will be notified separately before these works start.
