Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Progress summary

Works are nearing completion on the new Technical Applied Science building, Block L and it will soon be handed over to the school. The final works to take place include internal finishes and landscaping works. This includes planting trees along the Strettham Avenue fence line to create a natural bush screen for neighbours.

When this new building is operational, existing Block D will be made safe to demolish. This work was advised in a works notice to nearby residents that we are encapsulating the building in an airtight structure to remove asbestos containing materials. After the encapsulation structure is removed and a clearance certificate is received for the removal works, the demolition works will start.

Block H will also be demolished and the demountable administration facilities and art rooms along Kennedy Street will be removed.

Work hours

These works are taking place between the hours of 7 am and 5 pm Monday to Saturday. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.

Public works

In collaboration with Canterbury Bankstown Council, works to improve pedestrian and student safety near the school are now complete. Shari Avenue has a new footpath, Paul Street has a new pedestrian refuge island and trees have been planted along Kennedy Avenue. The school also has new bike parking facilities and a new accessway to its reception in Block A.
