Picton High School opened its doors in April of 1958. Prior to that, students attended a "Central School" operating at Picton Primary School.

Seven decades later, our community is again blessed with a new school. We have watched as the old made way for the new. The first and largest part of the new building program is now finished – all new buildings are completed.

Gone is the four-walled, teacher focused approach to teaching and learning. In are open plan designs and learning spaces. Libraries are now learning hubs, technology is integrated everywhere, and learning is more than teacher delivered. Students will be shown how to be facilitators of their own learning.

Getting to school

Key information on pedestrian and vehicular access to the new school facilities is outlined below.

School entrance

All entry to the school is now via the main gate on Argyle Street.

Pedestrian access

Pedestrians access to the school is via the stairs at Argyle Street.

Bus stop

Buses will drop-off and pick-up students at the new bus stop located on Argyle Street.

Kiss and drop zone

The kiss and drop zone is located adjacent to Building H at the southern end of Argyle Street.

Parking

Visitors must use local on-street parking. There is no on-site parking for school visitors.

Access

Accessibility provisions include ramps, tactile indicators, expansive footpaths and a new lift in Building E leading to the upper floor areas.

Traffic management

Traffic management will be in place on Argyle Street to assist pedestrians and to direct cars for the first few days of Term 2.

Where do I go on Day 1 Term 2?

Staff will be waiting to guide students to the assembly point for their year group.

What works are yet to be finalised?

We will finalise the remainder of the school upgrade during 2021. Remaining works include:

- upgraded hall
- upgraded technology
- applied science and automotive workshops
- upgraded bus shelter
- new agriculture shed
- landscaping, including sports oval.

We will provide regular progress updates as this work is completed.

Can I still enter the school via Wonga Road?

No, the Wonga Road entry is now closed. All access is via Argyle Street.
