Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Picton High School

A major project is underway to redevelop Picton High School. The redevelopment will provide new flexible learning spaces, a new library and administration area, performing arts spaces, special education facilities and a covered outdoor learning area and recreation areas. The existing hall will be refurbished.

The new school will have capacity for 1500 students.

Progress summary

The concrete structure is now complete, with structural steel and roofing installation underway. Internal fit-out and services rough-in have now commenced for all buildings.

School holiday works

Works will continue with the installation of structural steel and roofing material. External cladding installation will start at the beginning of July and work will continue on the internal fit-out and services rough-in for all buildings.

Work outside the construction boundary includes:

- Relocating hoarding around building F to allow plant room construction
- Relocating hoarding on Argyle Street to allow structure for building A
- Completing Wonga Road works for readiness for Day 1 Term 3
- Installation of kiss and drop pedestrian gate on Argyle Street
- Re-sheeting hall roof on east elevation

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

Works will continue with the installation of structural steel and roofing material. External cladding installation will start at the beginning of July and work will continue on the internal fit-out and services rough-in for all buildings.

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What are the construction working hours?

Monday to Friday: 7:00am to 6:00pm.

Saturdays: 8:00am to 1:00pm.

There will be no work on Sundays or Public holidays.

School Infrastructure NSW will notify the local community of any further changes to standard construction hours and will ensure work is considerate of neighbours with noise kept to a minimum.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access. This separation of the construction works has been done in accordance with Workplace Health and Safety Act, Department of Education requirements and the applicable Code of Practice.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Working within the State Significant Development (SSD) approved hours, and maintaining work in accordance with acoustic consultant advice already provided for the project.

Dust suppression methods will be used on the construction site to mitigate dust impacts including hosing down and covering loads.

How will traffic be managed?

A full time traffic controller is stationed at the front gate with all works in accordance with the issued Construction Traffic Management Plan.
