We are rebuilding a modern, flood resilient Richmond River High Campus to sit alongside Kadina High Campus and Lismore High Campus as part of The Rivers Secondary College.

The project will replace flood damaged facilities with new modern flood resilient spaces in a campus that is connected to Bundjalung Culture and reflects its rural school community.

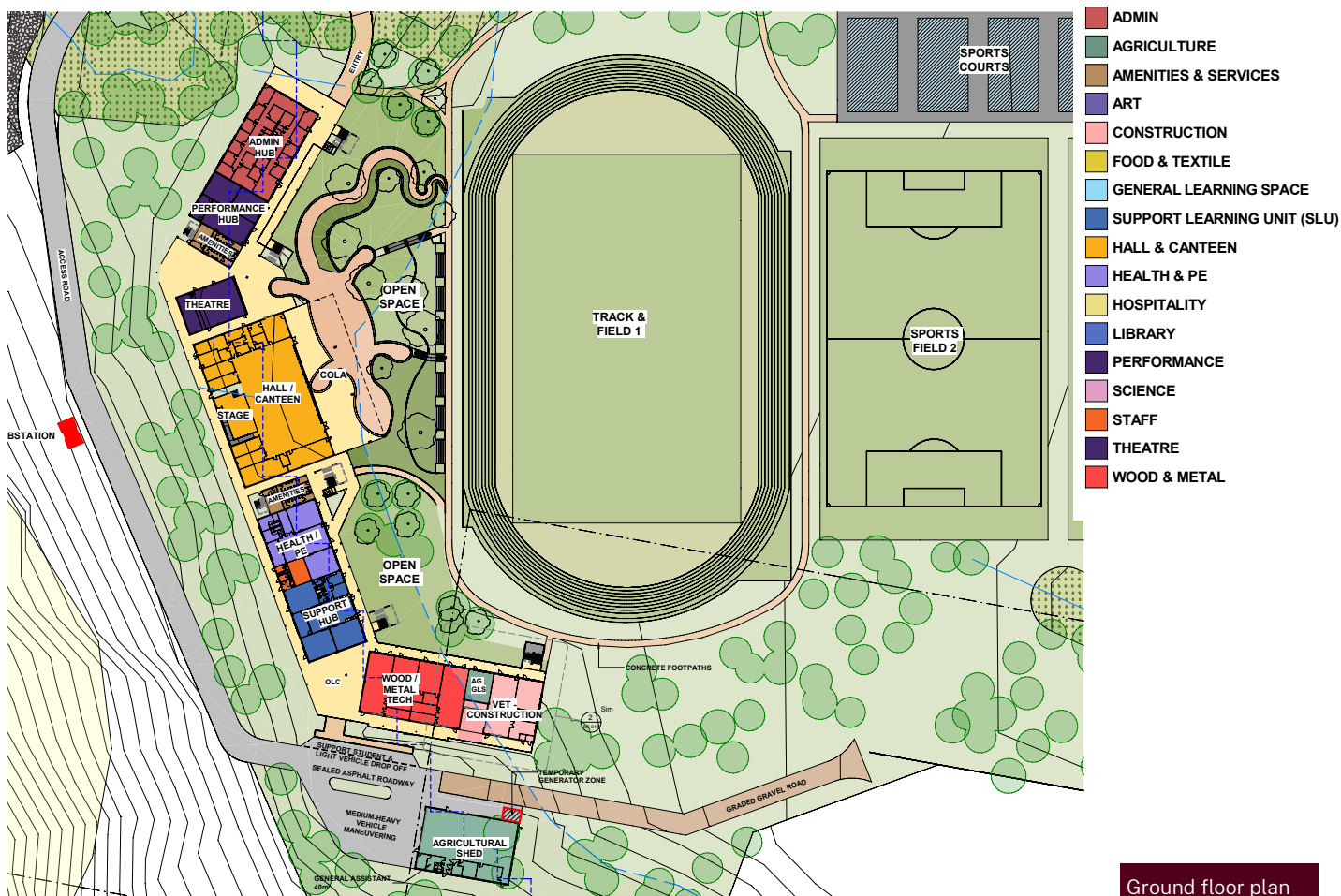

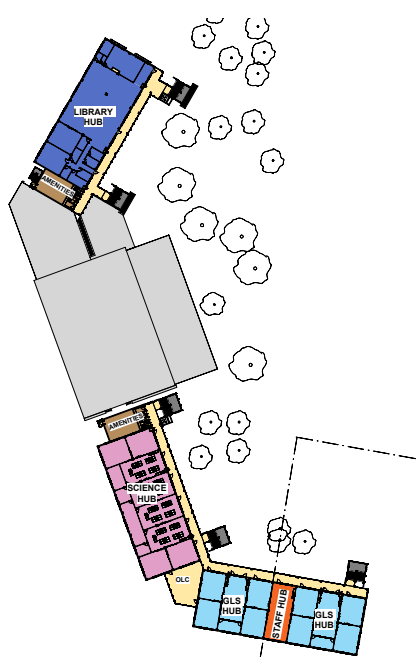


Modern flood resilient school spaces

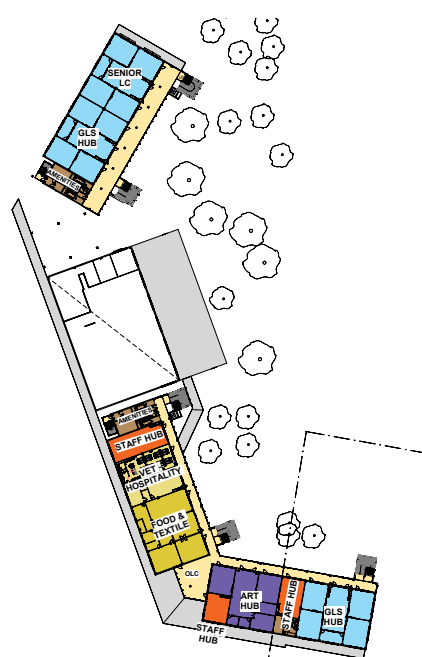
Richmond River High Campus will be relocated to a new flood resilient school site that is a two minute drive (900m) or 10 minute walk (750m) from the existing campus site at Lake Street, North Lismore. All classrooms and learning facilities will be built above the Probable Maximum Flood (PMF) height to minimise disruption from any future flooding and allow students to return to their own school sooner. The campus will include 20 general classrooms, 3 support classrooms, and specialist learning spaces.



Ground floor plan



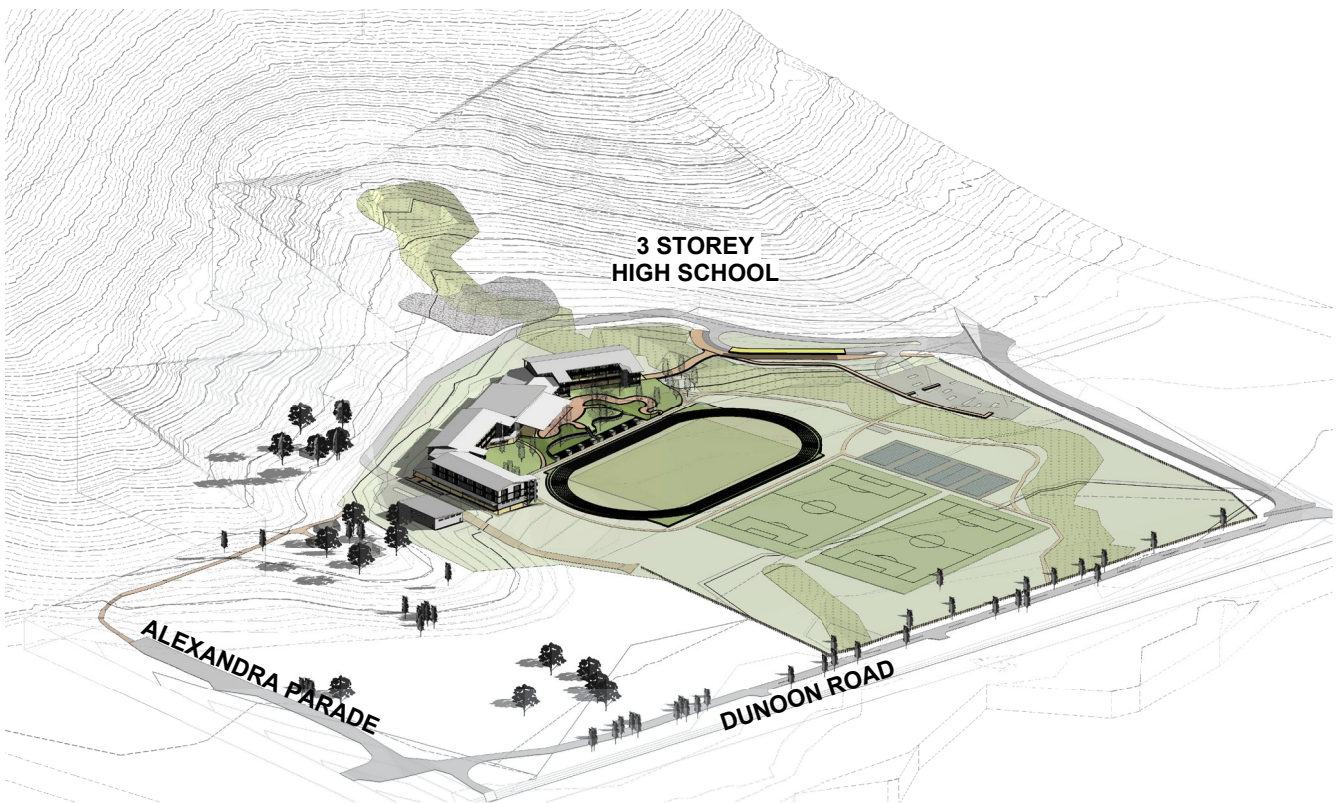
Level 1 floor plan

The campus will retain the rural outlook that students, staff, parents and carers told us they loved about the original campus site at Lake Street. Buildings will be placed on high ground overlooking the school sports fields and green space.

Connecting to Country

We are consulting with the traditional owners of the new school site to incorporate and celebrate the stories, traditions and Bundjalung heritage of the school site and surroundings in campus design, as well as the day-to-day operations of Richmond River High Campus.

Students and staff will be an important part of this consultation in coming months.

Next steps

1 - Design

The schematic design plans will be finalised to submit with the planning application. Once the planning application is submitted, we will finalise the detailed design needed for construction.

Connecting with Country consultation will also continue to make sure local cultural heritage is incorporated into the campus design and operations.

2 – Planning

Once we have finalised schematic designs and all the required information, we will submit a planning application to rebuild Richmond River High Campus. The planning application will be placed on public exhibition.

The school site will also be rezoned to allow for an educational facility.

3 – Construction

We will issue a request for tenders for construction of the new school facilities after we have lodged the planning application.

How can I get involved?

We are committed to working together with our school communities and other stakeholders to deliver the best possible facilities for students. We will keep the Lismore community up to date through the relocation and rebuilding of Richmond River High Campus.
