Project update

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Schofields Public School

A project is underway to redevelop Schofields Public School to accommodate the growing student population in the area, with new future-focused learning spaces and upgraded facilities to be built where the existing school facilities are located.

Progress summary

The State Significant Development Application (SSDA) was approved earlier this year. Work was approved to start on-site in late May 2019, with initial works involving preparing the site.

The ramp that leads from the temporary school to the hall has been blocked off to enable the construction of an on-site detention tank. The tank is required to control the amount of rainwater that flows into the stormwater system.

Next steps

The ramp will be reinstated when construction of the tank has been completed. We expect this work to take three months. In the meantime, access to the Hall will be via stairs or the footpath.

During Term 3 we expect to lay foundations for the new two-storey building and the COLA. Work to convert the former Administration building into a new canteen will also start.
