

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Project overview

Planning is continuing for an upgrade of Seven Hills High School to provide new specialist vocational education and training (VET) facilities as part of the NSW Government Vocational Schools Initiative. The proposed vocational facilities will primarily focus on three industry areas:

- Community and health services
- Construction (Electrotechnology and Plumbing)
- Supply chain (Transport, Logistics and Warehousing)

Progress summary

A concept design for the new vocational education and training facilities was developed in consultation with the school, architects, planners, Department of Education and TAFE NSW representatives. The facilities required to deliver industry standard courses have been identified and included in the concept design.

The Development Application (DA) for the school upgrade has been lodged with Blacktown City Council. The DA is available for viewing and comment via the Blacktown City Council website until 15 December, 2021. Use the application number SPP-21-00012 to locate it on the Council website. A hard copy of the application documents can be viewed by attending Council chambers.

A number of technical reports were prepared to support the planning approval process. These include a transport and traffic assessment which considers the impacts of the VET facility users from other schools.

Next steps

- Tender process for the appointment of a builder.
- Development of the schematic design.
- Determination of DA by Blacktown City Council.
