Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- The relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report;
- the prescribed matters under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000;
- the objects of the Act;
- all information submitted with the development application and during the assessment and information considered in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Assessment Report; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision.

The key reasons for granting consent to the development application are as follows:

- the project would provide a range of benefits for the region and the State, including new educational facilities, \$39.9 million capital investment, 300 construction jobs and 70 operational jobs;
- the project is permissible with development consent, and is consistent with NSW Government policies including the:
 - o A Metropolis of Three Cities The Greater Sydney Plan
 - State Infrastructure Strategy 2018-2038
 - NSW Future Transport Strategy 2056
 - North District Plan
- the impacts on the community and the environment can be appropriately minimised, managed or offset to an
 acceptable level, in accordance with applicable NSW Government policies and standards as identified in the
 Department's Assessment Report. The consent authority has imposed conditions relating to traffic and
 parking, sustainable travel and waste management.
- the issues raised by the community during consultation and in submissions have been considered and adequately addressed through changes to the project and the conditions of consent; and
- weighing all relevant considerations, the project is in the public interest.

Attachment 1 - Consideration of Community Views

The Department exhibited the Environmental Impact Statement for the project from 16 November 2017 until 15 December 2017 (30 days) and received seven public submissions, including 1 objection, primarily from residents living within five kilometres of the project site.

The key issues raised by the community (including in submissions) and considered in the Department's Assessment Report by the decision maker include traffic and parking, stormwater and drainage, school capacity, bike paths, operational waste and community use of facilities. Other issues are addressed in detail in the Department's Assessment Report.

Bike paths The bike path between Quarry Road, North Road and Blaxland Road could be completed across Crown land	 Assessment An informal on-road bike path already exists along Quarry Road, North Road, and Aeolus Avenue that connects to a shared off-road bike path on Blaxland Road. An on-road bike lane already exists on Lavarack Street connecting to Quarry Road and an informal on-road bike path currently exists on Smalls Road connecting to Quarry Road and Kent Street and the shared off-road bike path at Flinders Park and Tindarra Reserve. Bicycle parking is provided, and sustainable travel would be promoted by the school.
Operational waste How would operational waste be removed from the site?	Assessment The applicant has provided an Operational Waste Management Plan as part of the EIS detailing operational waste management. Conditions The OWMP would need to be developed in accordance with the documents submitted with the application.

Community use of facilities Make recreational areas accessible to the public Assessment The applicant provided information regarding community usage of facilities and playing fields as part of the EIS and is in consultation with Council regarding the ongoing shared usage agreement.
