Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

St Ives North Public School

An upgrade at St Ives North Public School is underway. The project will deliver new permanent innovative learning spaces and an upgrade to core facilities.

Progress summary

A development application has been lodged with Ku-ring-gai Council. The application includes the construction of a new multi-storey building to accommodate new learning spaces and administration areas.

The project team is working closely with school stakeholders during the school upgrade and to finalise the detailed design.

The contractor has completed the early works, including installation of safety fencing and hoarding in preparation for main works. Demolition is complete.

Next steps

Pending planning approvals, main works are expected to commence late 2019.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently. During this time we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.



Frequently asked questions

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth has been erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours. Dust from any works will be hosed down as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic control and security measures are in place where required for the safety of the community.

Will use of the school hall be impacted?

No. During the school upgrade, access to the hall for school functions will continue.

The school has notified external users of the hall advising of potential disruption during construction.

How will you keep us informed during construction?

School Infrastructure NSW will continue to share construction updates and project information as the project progresses. We will provide information through information booths, project updates, our website and school newsletters.
