Queanbeyan School for Specific Purposes (SSP)

A project is underway to build a new K-12 School for Specific Purposes (SSP) between Karabar High School and Queanbeyan South Public School. The project will deliver:

- Seven learning spaces for Kindergarten through to Year 12
- Withdrawal areas
- Outdoor learning areas
- Special programs rooms
- A library
- Administration and staff area.

Progress summary and school holiday works

Work will be done to complete the oval retaining wall and tiered seating at the back of site. The work to pour the concrete slabs for blocks A, B, C and D will start, followed by structural steel erection for each block.

Continuation of structural steel works in preparation for roof installation. Work will start on the roof and external wall cladding. Earth works to the front of the site will start. Continuation of in-ground services installation.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

Work will be done to complete the oval retaining wall and tiered seating at the back of site. The work to pour the concrete slabs for blocks A, B, C and D will start, followed by structural steel erection for each block.

Continuation of structural steel works in preparation for roof installation. Work will start on the roof and external wall cladding. Earth works to the front of the site will start. Continuation of in-ground services installation.

What are the construction working hours?

Monday to Friday: 7:00am to 6:00pm.

Saturday: 8:00am to 1:00pm

No work will take place on Sundays.

School Infrastructure NSW will notify the local community of any further changes to standard construction hours and will ensure work is considerate of neighbours with noise kept to a minimum.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access. Fence gates to the site will be closed.

Surveillance of the footpath will be undertaken during the holiday period.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures have been implemented on the construction site in accordance with planning approval requirements. Dust suppression methods include hosing down and covering loads.

Temporary fencing and shade cloth has also been erected to reduce dust impacts on the area.

How will traffic be managed?

During construction, a Traffic Management Plan is implemented to ensure the safety of students, teachers, staff, site visitors and residents.

Traffic control will continue to be in place for major deliveries at the site entrance on Alanbar Street.
