Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Tweed River High School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and core facilities. The scope of work includes new and refurbished learning spaces, a new library and senior learning environment, a new technology and applied studies building, enhanced student canteen and expanded hospitality teaching facilities including a new commercial kitchen.

Progress summary

Early works (Stage 1) started during the Term 1 school holidays and redevelopment of the student canteen is nearly finished.

A request for tenders (RFT) has been issued for the main construction works (Stage 2) and responses are due in August 2020.

The planning approval pathway for the project has been finalised and documentation is being prepared for lodgement with the relevant planning authorities.

Next steps

- Continue early works.
- Complete redevelopment of the canteen.
- Evaluate tender submissions and appoint a main works building contractor.
- Prepare planning approval documents for lodgement.
