The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Tweed River High School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and core facilities, as well as vocational education facilities. The upgrade will provide new and refurbished learning spaces, a new library, a new senior learning environment, a new, larger capacity school support unit, vocational education and training (VET) facilities for construction, hospitality and primary industries, and relocation and enhancement of performing arts facilities and learning spaces.

Progress summary

Work has started on the refurbishment of Block L to provide new science laboratories and general learning areas. The roof of the building is also being replaced. Internal refurbishment of Block K is continuing, to provide a larger capacity support unit for the school.

The development applications (DA) for both the external works to Block K and the main scope of work for the upgrade are currently being assessed by Tweed Shire Council.

Next steps

- Work with stakeholders to finalise the schematic design for construction of vocational education and performing arts facilities.
- Await development consent.
