Over the school holidays, the removal of Block A (the old administration building) will continue. Work will start on the new community garden and Circle of Friendship and the restoration of the heritage courtyard.

Managing the impact of our work

Due to the nature of our work, there may be increased noise and dust from machinery and other activities. We will ensure that work is completed safely and efficiently, and disruptions are minimised.

In line with the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Construction Work Days) Order 2020, School Infrastructure NSW construction sites can now operate on weekends and public holidays during the COVID-19 pandemic. This is to allow workers to maintain social distancing while on construction sites by distributing building work across the entire week. Works will take place Monday to Friday from 7:00am to 5:00pm and Saturday 7:00am to 1:00pm.

Frequently asked questions

What safety measures will be in place during construction?

Health and safety is our highest priority. We will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that construction works will be scheduled and managed to minimise impacts to the community where possible.

The contractor has a WHS officer on-site full time. All workers on site have been inducted, wear appropriate PPE and follow safe work methods. SINSW has a Project Management team conducting fortnightly site inspections, as well as a safety specialist conducting monthly audits.

How will traffic be managed?

Construction traffic will be managed according to the traffic management plan with minimal disruption to the local community.
