Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Wentworth Point new high school

Project overview

A new high school is being developed to cater for the growing population in the Wentworth Point, Sydney Olympic Park and Concord West communities. The school will be located on a part of 7 Burroway Road, Wentworth Point. The completed high school will have flexible teaching and learning spaces for approximately 1,500 students as well as a multipurpose hall for sports and performance, outdoor spaces including landscaped recreation areas, games courts and canteen facilities.

Progress update

- Piling works have started on site to prepare the foundations of the buildings.
- An information session was held Monday, 12 December to share an update on progress of construction. The information boards that were displayed can be viewed on our website: edu.nsw.link/WPNHS.

Following SSD approval and the appointment of the contractor, we can provide an update on the timeline for the new high school. It is expected that the new high school will be open for Year 7 in 2025. More information will be shared in the new year.

Next steps

- Finish piling works, then crane delivery and starting to pour foundation concrete slab.
- Formal school naming process in consultation with the community in 2023.
- After the Transport for NSW modification to change the location of Ridge Road and allow for the playing fields is approved by City of Parramatta, we will submit a modification for Phase 2 of the high school to the State Significant Development.

Wentworth Point Public School upgrade – Stage 2

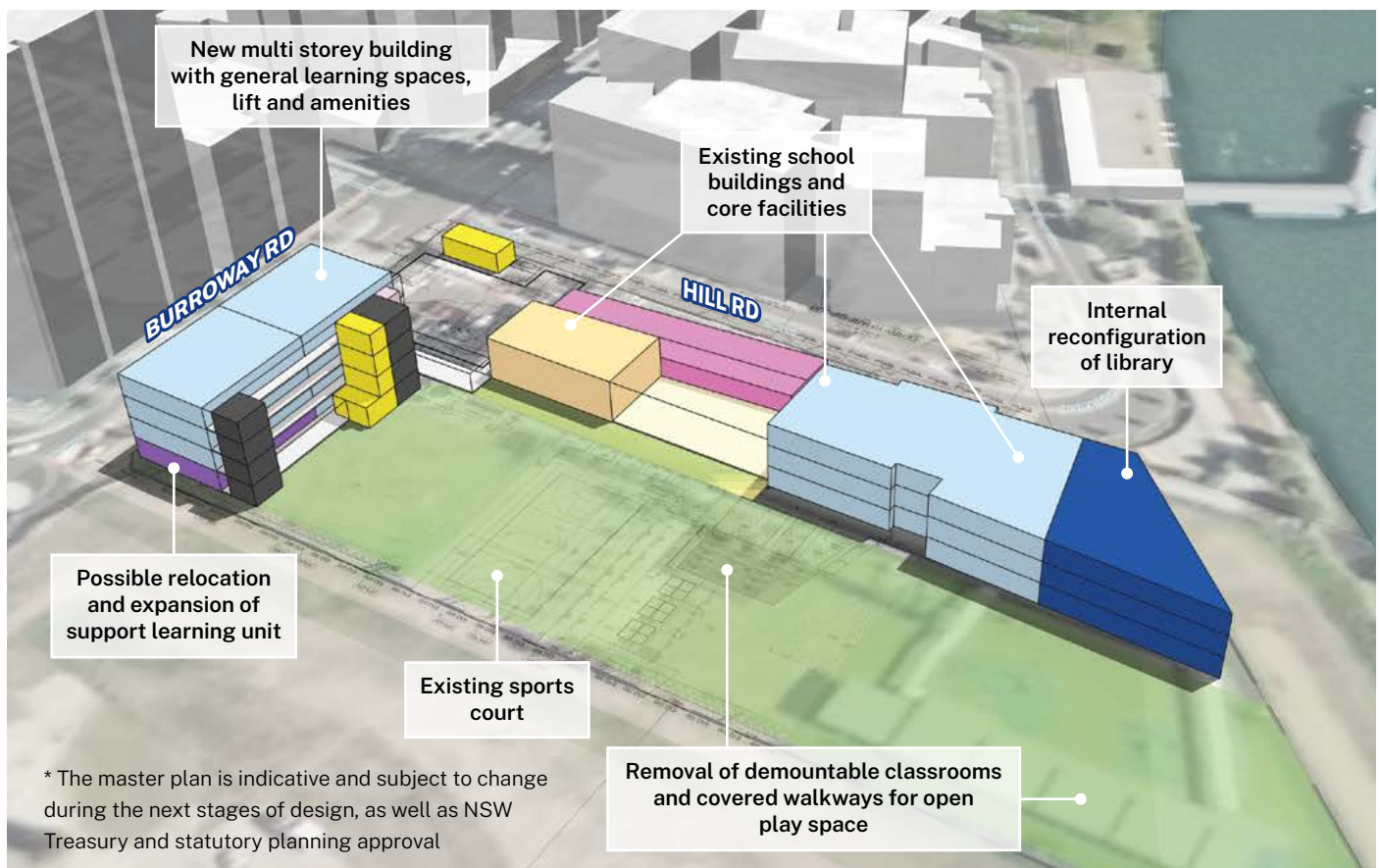
Project overview

A project to upgrade Wentworth Point Public School is in planning. The upgrade will include additional modern, fit for purpose permanent teaching spaces to meet growing enrolment demand in the area. It is also anticipated that the library will be reconfigured to better suit the needs of the school, with open space also maximised and improved.

Progress update


- The business case has been submitted to NSW treasury for approval.
