Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Planning for Stage 2 of Wentworth Point Public School

Funding for 44 new and upgraded school projects were announced as part of the NSW 2021/22 Budget including the upgrade of Wentworth Point Public School, which will include additional permanent teaching spaces to meet growing enrolment demand in the area.

The project is in the early planning phase and we will submit a business case seeking NSW Government approval to proceed.

Installation of temporary classrooms

Over the coming weeks, temporary classrooms in modern, double storey demountable units will be installed in the courtyard area adjoining Building B of Wentworth Point Public School. The demountables will accommodate enrolment demand, while maintaining open play space for students, as we plan and build Stage 2 works. The new temporary classrooms will be ready for the school to use from Day 1 Term 1 on 28 January 2022.

The double storey building will include eight new temporary classrooms placed in four sets of two with adjoining shared practical activities areas and smaller quiet learning rooms in each set. The building includes covered walkways and balcony areas, ramps, stairs and a lift.

Works start on site from Wednesday 24 November 2021

The demountables will be installed between 24 November 2021 and 25 January 2022, beginning with the establishment of site fencing and a construction compound (see map overleaf).

Following site establishment, deliveries are expected to start from 10 December 2021. This includes the delivery and installation of a 90-130 tonne mobile crane to enable the facilities to be lifted and placed safely around the school site.

During crane movements and all demountable building deliveries, traffic control measures will be in place. This includes temporarily closing the footpath in front of the school on Burroway Road on delivery days only.


There will be no access for construction vehicles between 8 am to 9:30 am and 2:30 pm to 3:30 pm to minimise disruption during school drop-off and pick-up. The footpath will remain open during these times also.

The mobile crane, demountable deliveries and construction vehicles will access the school site via the service entrance on Burroway Road (see site map). Traffic control will in place for the safety of the school, motorists and the local community. Access will be maintained to all residential properties at all times.

Working hours

Standard project working hours are 7 am to 5 pm, Monday to Saturday. Noisy works will be restricted after 1 pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.
