Wentworth Point Public School upgrade – Stage 2 Project update - March 2024

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

The 2023-24 Budget committed funding to progress with the upgrade to Wentworth Point Public School and the Wentworth Point new high school.

Wentworth Point Public School upgrade - Stage 2

Project overview

A project to upgrade Wentworth Point Public School is in progress. The upgrade will include additional modern, fit-for-purpose permanent classrooms to meet growing enrolment demand in the area. The library will be reconfigured to better suit the needs of the school, with open spaces maximised and the temporary demountable buildings removed.

Progress update

- The Development Application (DA) for the upgrade was lodged with City of Parramatta Council, has now been approved and the conditions of consent have been provided. - The tender process for a contractor to undertake the works will soon begin.

Next steps

- The contractor will be appointed and work with School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) to determine a timeline for the completion of the work as soon as possible.
- The final detailed designs for the upgrade will be developed with the contractor, SINSW and school leadership.
