## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$847 million is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

## West Ryde Public School upgrade

A project is underway to upgrade West Ryde Public School. The project will provide a new three-storey building with 14 modern learning spaces and a new library. There will also be an upgrade to core facilities with expected completion in mid-2020.

## Progress summary

The design for the upgrade is nearing completion. The existing temporary school facilities have been relocated on site to provide access to the construction site.

In early 2019, the construction contract will be awarded and the main construction works are scheduled to commence.

## Summer school holiday works

Over the summer holidays, site establishment will take place to prepare the work area so that construction works can begin in early-2019.

There will be no demolition work taking place over the summer holidays. The existing kiss and drop area will not change in Term 1, 2019.

Once construction commences, work will take place Monday to Friday, 7am to 5pm and Saturdays, 8am to 1pm. No work will take place on Sundays or Public Holidays.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently and we will minimise impacts on the community at every opportunity.
