Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Construction has begun on the Wilton Public School upgrade which includes:

- 22 new permanent flexible learning spaces including additional support units
- upgraded core facilities including the hall, administration, library, canteen, covered outdoor learning area (COLA), and covered walkway
- a new car park area.

Progress summary of work on building J

- Detailed earth works are now complete.
- All inground services for building J and within the school grounds are complete.
- The concrete structure for building J is now complete with roofing work underway.

Next steps

The work to take place on building J over the coming weeks includes:

- the roof and structural steel work will be continuing
- brick work and installation of walls and windows on building J will be soon underway.

Stage Two project update

We expect that the second stage of the upgrade will start from early 2023. This work includes upgrades to existing school buildings and school hall, a new covered outdoor learning area (COLA) and sports court.

Before construction starts on this portion of the work, the existing administration area and canteen will relocate to the demountable structures already present on site. More details on this will be available in the coming months.

Work hours

Construction works have been approved to occur between 7 am and 6 pm, Monday to Friday and 8 am to 1 pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless otherwise advised.

Traffic management during the work

Traffic control will be in place as required to manage pedestrian and vehicular movements near the construction site access points. Should there need to be any changes to this access in and around the site, we will let you know ahead of the work.

Noise and dust control measures during the work

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements, including the spreading of road base onto soil areas to suppress dust. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.

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
