Project update | September 2023

Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade the boarding accommodation at Yanco Agricultural High School. The upgrade involves the construction of new accommodation facilities and improvements to existing buildings.

The project aims to deliver enhanced learning outcomes for students through improved accommodation with:

- the removal of the temporary female boarding facilities
- the construction of a new permanent female boarding facility
- the partial refurbishment of existing male and female permanent boarding facilities to ensure they are fit for purpose.

Progress update

Consent to refurbish the heritage listed male dormitory buildings was granted August 2023 by Heritage NSW, a consent required as part of our Development Application. We are developing a construction timeline of these works in accordance with the conditions set by Heritage NSW and school operations when students are not occupying these dormitories.

The refurbishment works include:

- Breakwell and Gardiner Buildings – furniture upgrade.
- Hindmarsh Building – improved access to dormitories on the ground floor and furniture upgrade
- Mutch Buildings – minor refurbishment

Construction of the new female boarding facility is continuing with the foundations including concrete slabs, inground infrastructure and provision of the base of the lift have been completed.

Next steps

- Upcoming works at the new female boarding facility includes ground floor block work, first floor formwork and establishing the upper concrete slab.
- Male dormitory refurbishments sympathetic to heritage structures while suiting school operational needs.
