Project update | July 2023

Project overview

We are restoring historic stone and masonry at Annandale North Public School. Work on Building C includes stone and brickwork restoration and a complete roof replacement and roof drainage works. The historic building houses nine classrooms, the library, the uniform shop and a staffroom.

Update on progress

The work to restore the building is being done in two stages. Stage one began in March 2022 on the southern part of the building and involved stone and brick cleaning, stone replacement and repairs, brick repointing, repairs to the two cupolas, timber repairs and painting. This was completed in March of this year.

Stage two began in December 2022 and involves a full roof replacement, the drainage works associated with it and work on the northern section of the building.

The roof replacement is continuing as is the work on the northern part of the building which includes stone replacement and repairs, timber work repairs to the barges, eaves, doors and windows, repainting external surfaces and restoration of garden beds and external surfaces.

Restoration of this historical building is carried out by skilled stonemasons, who practice the ancient trade of stonemasonry, handcrafting sandstone to maintain and preserve the significance of this heritage building. Because much of the work is done by hand, it takes time and care to masterfully handcraft sandstone in the same way it was when the school's historic main building was constructed.

We currently anticipate all works will be completed in early 2024.
