Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing in our schools through the Heritage Stonework Restoration Program, which looks after historic school buildings across the state.

Under Section 170 of the *Heritage Act 1977*, we must identify, protect and manage heritage school buildings in our care. This program helps us do that, but it also ensures your school's historic buildings are cared for and protected for future generations.

Working together, our heritage architects, engineers and skilled stonemasons carefully restore each building using traditional tools and techniques, keeping them safe, strong and beautiful for years to come.

Heritage stonework restoration at Broken Hill North Public School

We are writing to provide an update on the restoration and repair of Buildings A, C and F at Broken Hill North Public School.

Since our last update in [April 2025](#), we have continued to work closely with school leadership to plan and deliver this work while minimising impacts on students, staff and the wider school community.

The project is delivering a range of improvements across the school, including:



Heritage stonework restoration and repair works



Landscaping improvements



Stormwater upgrades



New cricket nets installed to surrounding play areas and infrastructure



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Progress update

We have now completed the heritage stonework restoration of Building A.

The first floor of Building A will return to use once we finish replacing the carpets and prepare the space for students and staff.

We have also completed several improvements across the school, including new cricket nets for School of Air students and a sensory play space between Buildings A and B to support student wellbeing, inclusion and outdoor learning opportunities.

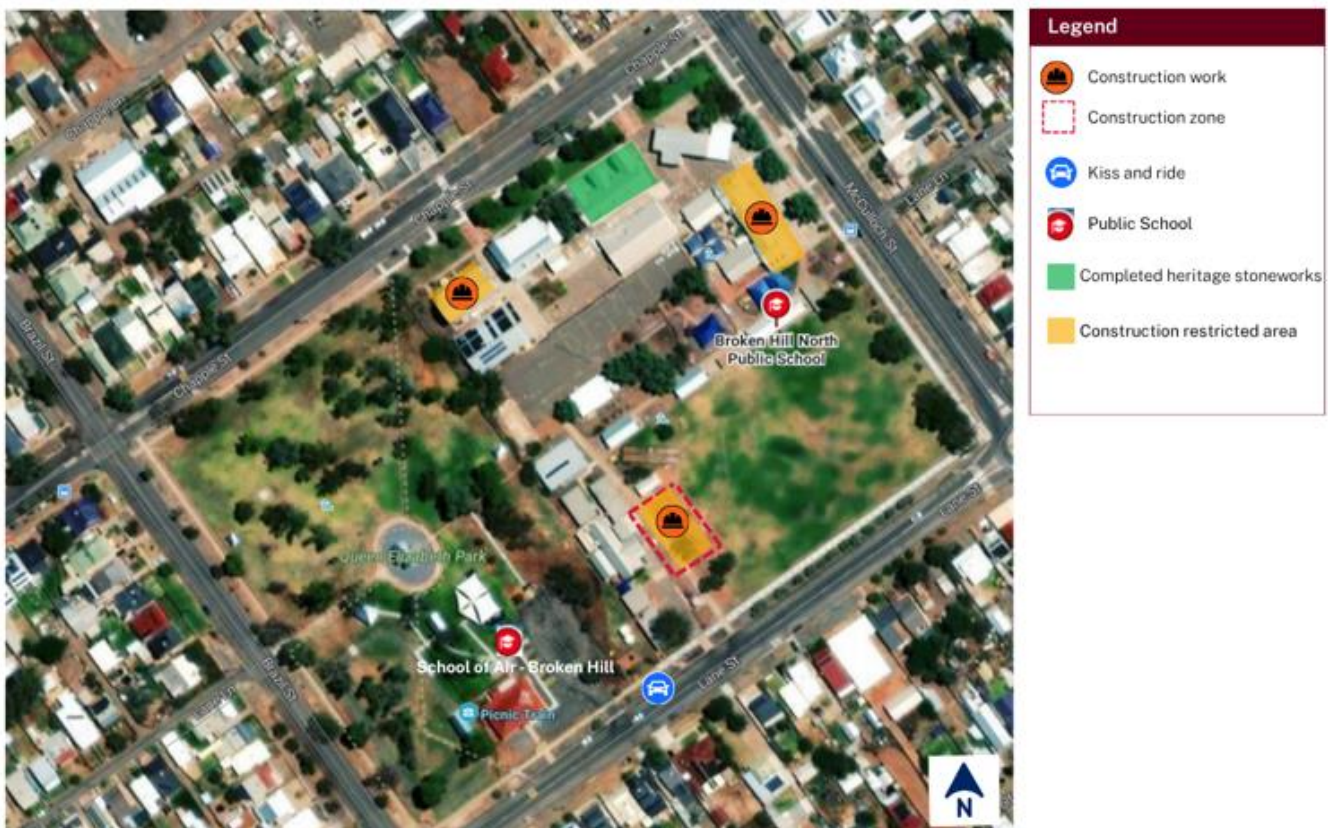
Next steps

We are continuing to consider future options for Buildings C and F, which will remain fenced and out of bounds at this time.

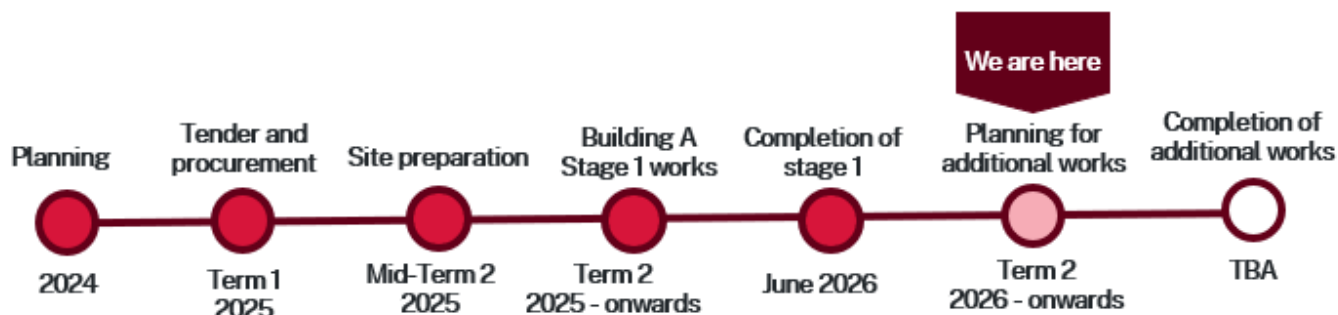
These buildings are an important part of the school's history, and we will continue to work with the school as planning progresses.
