

# Dubbo North Public School

## Works notification | 24 July 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

On Monday 21 July 2025 a cleaner found a window had been damaged in a Building F classroom at Dubbo North Public School.

Due to a [previous window replacement](#) earlier this year in the same classroom requiring the removal of bonded asbestos-containing material (ACM), as a precaution, it is assumed that ACM is located in the putty around the damaged window.

The room was closed to students and staff and learning was relocated to another classroom on the school site. A contractor covered the damaged window with plywood.

NSW Health explains that “living or working with asbestos, or just being around it, is a low risk to your health as long as the asbestos is in good condition and not damaged”.

A contractor removed the window putty and replaced the damaged window this morning (Thursday 24 July 2025).

All work involving asbestos-containing materials took place outside of school hours.

All work was done in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education’s Asbestos Management Plan. Safety measures were in place while work was being done. All work was completed by licensed asbestos contractors and inspected by independent hygienists.

The area was inspected this morning by the independent hygienist to confirm it has been fully remediated, and a clearance certificate was issued before the room was reopened.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of all members of our school and the community are our highest priorities.
