## Homebush Public School Works notification | 14 May 2025

Dear staff, parents, carers and neighbours,

We are upgrading key school facilities at Homebush Public School.

These works will take place between Monday 26 May and Monday 30 June 2025.

This upgrade includes:

- replacing damaged asphalt in different areas across the school, as indicated in the image overleaf
- applying acrylic coating to the basketball court
- installing synthetic grass on the mini soccer field.

Work hours will be Monday to Friday between 7:30 am and 5:30 pm, and Saturdays between 8 am and 1 pm, in line with NSW Environment Protection Authority guidelines.

The main play area and oval will be closed to students and staff, with temporary fencing in place during the works.

Students will be relocated to the north side of the school for their recess and lunch breaks. The school will organise these breaks in stages to give students enough play space at each break time.

Access for students and staff to school buildings will be made available through temporary walkways.

Work vehicles will enter the school through Rochester Street and park within the construction site on the school grounds.

Please be aware there may be an increase in noise during this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise where possible.
