Works notification | 26 March 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Following our notification on 11 March 2025 (included below), we received additional test results showing traces of lead from a classroom tap in Building C and bubblers south of the Building E boys toilets at Kulnura Public School.

Remediation has now been completed by a qualified and accredited tradesperson on all affected taps and bubblers.

Re-testing of the affected tap outlets by the independent hygienist has confirmed the results meet the requirements of the [Australian Drinking Water Guidelines](#).

Access to taps and bubblers in the following locations have now been restored:

- classroom tap in Building C
- bubblers east and south of the Building E boys toilets.

The health, safety and wellbeing of all members of our school and the local community are our highest priorities.

Works notification issued 11 March 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Drinking water was recently tested at Kulnura Public School as part of our routine water quality testing program.

Traces of bacteria were detected in samples collected from tap and bubbler outlets in the following locations:

- a classroom tap in Building C
- bubblers east of Building E.



Access to the tap and bubblers has been restricted, and signage has been installed to remind students and staff not to use them. The school has been provided with bottled drinking water and already had hand sanitiser in storage.

We are working with an independent hygienist to undertake the required remediation work.

Work started on Monday 10 March 2025 and will be carried out by qualified and licensed contractors.

When work is complete, the independent hygienist will retest the water to ensure it meets the requirements of the [Australian Drinking Water Guidelines](#).

The health, safety and wellbeing of the school and the local community is our highest priority.
