Works notification | 12 March 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Drinking water was recently tested at Mount Pleasant Public School as part of our routine water quality testing program.

Following our notification on 5 March 2025 (below), we received an additional test result showing traces of lead from a tap outlet in a Building G classroom.

Access to the tap was already restricted, and signage was already installed to remind students and staff not to use it. The school has been provided with bottled drinking water and hand sanitiser for handwashing.

We are working with an independent hygienist to undertake the required remediation work.

Work for this tap has been scheduled to start on **Wednesday 12 March 2025** and will be carried out by qualified and licensed contractors. When work is finished on this separate location, the school will receive a clearance certificated from the independent hygienist to continue using the tap.

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Drinking water was recently tested at Mount Pleasant Public School as part of our routine water quality testing program.

Traces of bacteria were detected in samples collected from taps and bubblers in the school.

Access to all taps and bubblers has been restricted, and signage has been installed to remind students and staff not to use them. The school has been provided with bottled drinking water and hand sanitiser for handwashing.

We are working with an independent hygienist to undertake the required remediation work.

Work has been scheduled to start on Wednesday 5 March 2025 and will be carried out by qualified and licensed contractors.



When work is complete, the independent hygienist will retest the water to ensure it meets the requirements of the [Australian Drinking Water Guidelines](#).
