## Newport Public School Works notification | 6 February 2025

Dear staff, parents and carers,

Further to the works notification issued on 18 December 2024, work is progressing on the refurbishment of the Building E toilets at Newport Public School.

Asbestos removal work was completed on Friday 20 December. All work was completed in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan.

Safety measures including air monitoring were in place while this work was undertaken, and all work was completed by licensed asbestos contractors and monitored by independent hygienists.

The remaining work on the bathrooms has progressed well, however replacing the partition walls has required more time. The partitions are expected to be installed by the end of Week 3 Term 1, with the bathrooms open for student use by Week 4 Term 1.

There are other bathroom facilities available for students in the meantime.

## Asbestos removal

During this work, we are also replacing the ceiling sheets and toilet partition walls, which contain bonded asbestos.

Work involving asbestos-containing materials will take place outside school operating hours with safety measures in place.

All work will be done in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan. All work will be completed by licensed asbestos contractors and monitored by independent hygienists.
